Use appropriate strategies to resolve problems in comprehension. 2. Metacognition. Metacognition can be defined as "thinking about thinking." Good readers use metacognitive strategies to think about and have control over their reading. Before reading, they might clarify their purpose for reading and preview the text.

The authors attend to both the importance of explicit instruction in comprehension strategies and providing learners with a "great deal of time and opportunity for actual reading, writing, and discussion of text" (p. 2), making a convincing case for adult educators to use both.

Effective Practices for Developing Reading Comprehension ...

At the heart of the direct instruction method are explicit explanations, modeling or demonstrating, and guided practice. Direct/explicit instruction needs to be an integral part of learning the major content strands of the reading process—phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.

Reading Research Center summarized the key ideas that are instrumental in fostering motivated, lifelong readers. Five years of research on fostering reading growth showed that reading skills and strategies can be taught effectively and efficiently in preschool and elementary school reading programs when instruction is systematic and explicit.

The CESE literature review 'Effective reading instruction in the early years of school' summarises this research and concludes that, to be most successful, the five key components must be taught explicitly, sequentially and systematically. The evidence identifies five key components of effective reading programs:

To ensure that children develop comprehension skills, effective reading instruction builds on their prior knowledge and experience, language skills, and higher-level thinking. Motivation to read is the essential element for actively engaging children in the reading process. It is the fuel that lights the fire and keeps it burning.
